


Surveyor General's Office Oct 5. 11<sup>th</sup> 1763.

Underneath by the Letters A.B.d.a. is repented 47 1/2 acres of land Surveyed by Z. Butcher for John Eiler the 3<sup>rd</sup> of May 1739 by Warrant of ye 11<sup>th</sup> of October 1738 - which Rich Peters Esq. Late Secretary Ordered N. Scull ~~then~~ Late S. Galt to accept into his Office on 5<sup>th</sup> Elder paying 20 £ into vs. Receive (obliterated) Office - The small piece a.b.c.d. is a piece Taken ~~in by J. Armstrong. Tho' he should no mention of his Taking in any vacant Land, Neither is it Certain that it is vacant Land for I have not Searched neather Armstrong or some other person hath not a Warrant for it~~

Now as the lines differ so much, whether this resurvey ought to be accepted as a resurvey or not, the Surveyor General's <sup>advised</sup> opinion ~~is~~ so that the Dec<sup>y</sup> may see if there is any objections, others (..... obliterated.....) ately grant a war for as obliterated... thereof
