



A Draught of a Tract or Piece of Land, Situate in Cedars Township in the County of York. Containing as above set forth 85 $\frac{1}{2}$ & 157 Perches & allowance &c. a part of 192 $\frac{1}{2}$ ad
 t. allowance for which was originally surveyed on the 8th of the 4th month 1767, by Mr. Matthews late D. S. In pursuance of two applications # 2340 & # 2343 the one
 for 200 $\frac{1}{2}$ ad and the other for 150 $\frac{1}{2}$ granted to Michael Tewman, bearing date the 14th day of January 1767. Since divided to now on the 7th day of September A.D. 1837. Ex-
 amined & Corrected the above ad. at the request of Jacob Dreyer, the present owner, who requested me to make return of the same for Confirmation. I further state
 that the heirs of Jacob Dreyer, deceased, claims the small triangle above within the Red lines, containing 32 perches & allowance. 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ in pursuance of a Survey made on the
 15th day of May A.D. 1811, under a Warrant granted to George Dreyer, for 112 $\frac{1}{2}$ ad bearing date the 20th day of March A.D. 1811. All of which nevertheless submitted to
 the Surveyor General
