



I do hereby certify that the two above described Lots of Ground situate in the Town of Easton were originally laid out & Survey'd unto Conrad Dreicer late of Easton Jan-
ner deceased, whom and by his last Will and Testament in Writing under his hand and Seal dated the 1st day of January anno 1765 did give and devise the same unto his
wife Elizabeth Dreicer her Heire and Assigns and constituted his said Executrix thereof and soon after died. And the said Elizabeth took upon her the further Execution
thereof, as by the same Will proved and remaining in the Register's Office at Easton appears. Which said Elizabeth by an Article of Agreement made the 12th
day of October anno 1765 between her and Henry Bent now of Easton aforesaid for the Consideration therein mentioned sold and conveyed the said Lots to the
said Henry in Fee; as by the same may appear; which said Lots are bounded and described as follows vizt on the South by _____ Street, on the West by _____
creek Land, on the North by Bushkill Creek and on the East by Hamilton Street, containing respectively sixty feet in front and 263 feet in depth from _____ St.
to the said Creek; and are marked in the General Map or Plan of the said Town 260 & 261 respectively. And further that there is one good Square log dwell-
ing House thereon together with a Barnhouse & other Improvements. Witness my Hand the 26th August 1766
