



A. Situate partly in Cedars and partly in Shrewsbury Township, in the County of York, containing as above set forth forty one acres forty one perches and an allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Being part of a larger tract of 61a 9d 6s allowance originally surveyed by William Matthews late D.S. on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of the 1<sup>st</sup> mo 1773, in pursuance of two Marrants granted to Thomas Clinor, one for 25a dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of February 1772, the other for 50a dated the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of June 1773 said part resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of March 1822. B. being also part of the same tract, resurveyed and divided off from said tract by William Keeney late D.S. on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 1784. Containing as above set forth six acres, fifty eight perches & an allowance as aforesaid and now at the request of Martin Karkel the present owner, said part is examined, corrected calculated, and together with the other part returned for confirmation.
