



The above draft represents a tract of land situate on one of the head branches of Birch run in West Calm Township Chester County containing forty acres seventy one perches and allowance of six per cent & Surveyed for James W. Brown Esq December 23rd 1847 by virtue of a warrant issued by John Cochran Secy Land Office and granted to John W. Crimer bearing date January 2nd 1845 directing Arthur Andrews Jr Esq D. S. to execute it and make return of the Survey into the Surveyor General office according to law signed Richard T. Leech D. C.

A part of the above described premises appears to have been cultivated in former years on which at the present time there is timber growing about seven acres is now under fence and formed on which is a loghouse and stable. The premises is occupied by Robert and Margaret Fulton and from the best information I can gather I am induced to believe that the above described tract of land and improvement has been in the undisturbed and undisputed possession of Mrs Fulton and her ancestors for 20 or 100 years. There cannot be a doubt but that the settlement commenced prior to the 28th day of March 1814. The land is not of much value the timber being principally cut off.
