



A Draught of 5^{ac} 12 perches of land with allowance of 6 per cent for Roads &c situate in Union Township Dauphin County Surveyed June 19th 1851 in pursuance of a warrant to James Alexander for 5 acres dated May 20th 1844. The field of Robert Taylor extends to the run as above represented shaded red, covering about half an acre of this survey, including his spring house. The land appears to have been cleared a number of years, the stumps mostly gone. James Alexander alleges that the fence has been extended to its present location since he obtained a warrant for the land.
