The ^{above} survey is composed of a part of an Original tract of land, called Norfolk, surveyed for Robert Harrison in pursuance of an application No 548, Dated April 3^d 1769. (as represented by the Creek and the dotted lines above) situate on the West side of the Monongahela River - Containing 273 Acres and 153 perches & Allowance.
