

Draft of a tract of ^{unimproved} land situate in Liberty township Duquesne County, adjoining land occupied by the "Steam Saw Mill Company" (supposed to be vacant) on the North - lands of said Company in the Warrantee names of "Abraham Shrack & Catherine Crawford" in Great Bend township on the east; land of H. Chidester on the South and lands of Stephen Ross & Orrin Dackatt in the Warrantee names of "James Hutchinsonson & Robert Keysham" on the west - containing 64 Acres & 137 perches & allowance of 6 per cent. Surveyed Feb 19th A.D. 1870 in pursuance of a Warrant bearing date Aug. 28th A.D. 1869 - for 75 acres & allowance, to Holdridge Chidester. - The lot being more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a post & stones corner of improved land of said Chidester in the east line of James Hutchinsonson Warrant - thence by said Chidester's land South 87° East 45 perches to a post & stones in township line & supposed west line of the "Catherine Crawford" Warrant; thence by the same & the supposed N. line of the "Abraham Shrack" Warrant north 3° East 250 perches to a cluster of Water Beeches; thence North 87° West 45 perches to a post & stones corner in the east line of "Robert Keysham" warrant; thence by the same & the Warrant first named (both being known as of the "Kirby & Law" lands) South 2° 35' West 250 perches to the place of beginning; - The courses here given being the present apparent bearing being full 5° west of the true North. March 1. 1870 James M. Chapman County Surveyor

Note: It is proper that I should state that the owners of the "Steam Saw Mill" Property claim that their purchase in the Warrant names of Catherine Crawford & Abraham & Adam Shrack extends westward to the well known "Kirby & Law" line. But from the search & investigation I have thus far made I think they only extend to the old township line. I have withheld this information since the 19th ult. in hopes of learning something more definitely, but as it is about 6 months since the Warrant was rec^d. I send it without further delay - but may ask if I should find evidence that they extend further west to offer an amended Return hereafter. With due Respect - James W. Chapman
