of 232<sup>1/2</sup> and allowance which was Originally Surveyed by Thomas Cookson late D.S. on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 1744,  
in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Francis Fincher bearing date the 12<sup>th</sup> day of January 1743. Resur-  
veyed and divided off from the said larger Tract the 28<sup>th</sup> day of November 1820, at the instance and  
request of John Cline & Henry Ensmenger the present owners. —
