



The annex is the diagram of a tract of land situate on the waters of the middle fork of Kennebec creek in Amwell Township Washington County surveyed August 12<sup>th</sup> 1816 on a warrant granted to John Moore dated 17<sup>th</sup> July 1816 & resumed November 8<sup>th</sup> 1836 in pursuance of the decision of the board of property dated March or May 1<sup>st</sup> 1819 and order of the surveyor general of the 8<sup>th</sup> May 1836. The dotted lines represent that part of said survey which is taken away by other titles. Letter C represents the interference with the Rev. Cephas Dodd's survey letter D with James Banes' letter C with Abraham Banes' letter D. with Tobiah Clutter's letter C and F with Rev. Wright and Samuel H. Farland's surveys which it is said has been in the possession of them and their successors over twenty one years. Moore's settlement is in diagram G and not in diagram F as represented in the return. Survey made by James Reed. All the heirs of Moore who are of age say that they do not wish a patent to issue to them for any other part of the survey but that which is contained in diagram G which is represented by the and is in fact all that is clear of interference with other titles and contains eighteen acres and one hundred and twenty eight poles and allowance
