



Sur Wt to Richard Longher 8th Feb. 1748/9

A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Rockhill Township in the county of Bucks and Province of Pennsylvania Being part of a Tract of 104 Acres and allowance, at first taken up by John Gedder about the year 1750 or 1751. — The above part thereof being now purchased by Ludowig Smith: Beginning at a post a Corner of Richard Roberts Land Thence by the same East 78 1/2 perches to a white oak a Corner of Jacob Zerly's Land, Thence by the same South 90 perches to a Stone in the line of William Mock's Land, Thence by the same West 127 perches to a post set for a Corner of Henry Matthews' Land, Thence by the same North 55 perches to a stone in the Line of Thomas Roberts Land, Thence by the same South 71^d East 31 1/2 perches to a white oak and by the same North 22 1/2^{degrs} East 50 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing Sixty one Acres and 42 perches of Land, or Fifty seven Acres and 127 perches of Land together with the usual Allowance of Six per Cent for Roads.
