



Situate in Union township (late Buffaloe) in the County of Union Surveyed the 21<sup>st</sup> day of May 1825, for the heirs & legal representatives of George Goubler late of the County aforesaid Deed to wit Dorothy Goubler Widow, Peter Arbogast & Catharine his wife, William Goubler Elizabeth Snyder late Elizabeth Goubler widow of Jacob Snyder Deed, Samuel Goubler Jacob Goubler, Daniel Goubler, Jacob Witmer and Ann Maria his wife John Goubler, Elizabeth Samuel, Peter, Daniel & John Arnold heirs and legal representatives of Margaret Goubler who was intermarried with John Arnold who are both Deed Sally, Elizabeth, Christina, Abraham, George & Molly Goubler heirs and legal representatives of George Goubler Deed who was one of the heirs and legal representatives of George Goubler the elder Deed Containing one hundred and seventy five Acres with the usual allowance of Six per Cent &c It being part of a tract of land Surveyed on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of March 1804 by William Montgomery Esq. then Deputy Surveyor for Christian Richter and Joseph Doebler in pursuance of their Warrant bearing Date the 27<sup>th</sup> July 1792 Containing two hundred & seventy nine acres & seventy nine perches - More eighty three Acres & 157 perches equal to three hundred and sixty three acres & sixty six perches with the usual allowance of Six per Cent &c
