



Whereas in pursuance of a Warrant from the former Comm<sup>r</sup> of Property dated the 7<sup>th</sup> of September 1684 there was soon after Survey'd unto Samuel Levis of Chester County a Tract of Land sit. in ye part of the sd Co: since called ye Townp. of Willis Town in right of the sd S. Levis's purchase of one moiety of 1000<sup>0</sup> originally granted to Jn<sup>r</sup>. Love the proportion of Liberty Land thereto appurt<sup>r</sup> first deducted, wch<sup>r</sup> sd Tract being Resurveyed by Is. Taylor in pursuance of a Gen<sup>r</sup>l Warrt from the late Comm<sup>r</sup> of Property for Resur<sup>r</sup> the Co: afores<sup>t</sup> was found to be limited & bound<sup>d</sup> as follows Vizt. Sit. in the Townp. of Willis Town Begin<sup>r</sup> at a red oak at a corner of the Lands of Tho: Barker & Company, of Tho: Massey & Francis Yarnal & extend<sup>r</sup> thence by sd Yarnal's Land S.G.G.W. 157 per to a W.O. thence by William Garret's Land N.24W. 680 per. thence by a line of marked Trees N.G.G.E. 157 per to a corner of the Land of sd Barker & Compa: thence by the same S.24E. 680 to the begin<sup>r</sup> contain<sup>r</sup> 492 1/2 & allow of 10<sup>0</sup> ff Cent as usual on Resurveys & an Overplus of 119<sup>0</sup> & allow: of 6<sup>0</sup> ff Cent.

Returned into the Secret<sup>r</sup>ry's Office the 19<sup>th</sup> of September A.D. 1737.

The said Samuel Levis about the year 1724 having granted 300<sup>0</sup> of the above.

Tract to his daught<sup>r</sup> Eliz<sup>o</sup> & 200<sup>0</sup> to his daughter Mary Pennock wife of Jos.

*fl* Benja. Eastburn Surv<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>r</sup>

Pennock the tract was proportionally divided, & the sd Mary's part being

1/3 of his whole right was separately return<sup>d</sup> & co: the day afores<sup>t</sup> In Pur-

sueance of a Warrt from the proprietary dated the same day.
