



This Tract of Land Resurveyed at the Request of John Parsons Lying in Wrights Town in the County of Bucks Beginning at a whit oak standing by the Road Leading to buckingham from new town then north west thirty seven perches to a post then north five degrees west four hundred and sixty eight perches by John Parsons other land and part of ben clanks land to a small whit oak then south west one hundred and fifty five perches to a black oak by part of Buckingham Township then south one degree East three hundred and sixty ^{obt} perches by John Terry's land ^{obt} post then south west twelve perches to a post then South East one hundred and twenty perches to a small black oak then north East one hundred and twenty perches by Joseph Chapman's Land to the place of beginning Containing three hundred and Eighty eight acres of land surveyed in the 5 month 1739.

The above described land was by John Cutler's Resurvey of Wrights Town called George Rigg & vacant. There was a piece of land of 30 acres which belonged to the proprietor John Parsons. John Parsons former draught and he was willing to have it included in his draught if the proprietor and he can agree about it from John Chapman. John Parsons obtained a Warrt from the late Comm^r dated the 28th Gth m^o 1725 for 179th the Rem^r of 500th the original purchase of Joseph Hall ^{about yr 2 year 1718}. And he says he agreed with the Comm^r for a Vacancy of 150th belonging to the proprietary a Warrt to be made out of the 150th & also directions about the 30 acres. Said Warrt dated the 8th of 7ber 1740 for the whole vist to accept & the SurvL of 190.52th & allowance both & returned within one ^{obt} Supt^r ye 8th of 7ber 1740.
