



Draught of a tract of land, situate on the waters of Peters Creek in Jefferson township, Allegheny (formerly Washington) County, Penn. Surveyed 28th, 29th & 30th days of January A.D. 1847, in pursuance of a Warrant for 160 Acres bearing date the 10th day of December 1784, to John Rayburn, Containing ninety four acres and one hundred and fifty eight perches and fifty three hundredths of a perch, with an allowance for Roads & Highways, proportioned at 6 per Cent.

Notes. 1. - The small part "A" was thrown off and the part marked "B" was taken in, in pursuance of an Agreement between Jonathan Lowe and James Gilliam (dec'd) on the 7th April 1820, as certified to by D. Coon, Esq. D.S. and acknowledged by the present owners. Lowe sold to Hugh Kennedy, who took out a Warrant and Patent for the same, excluding the part marked "B".

2. - The part marked "C" was formerly included in a Survey made the 16th February 1773, in pursuance of a Warrant! dated the 21st February 1772, to John Reed, and was surveyed by Alexander McClean, D.S. but afterwards left out of the patent to William Reed for "Reed Hill" the 2nd April 1803, upon a Survey upon a Warrant dated the 10th February 1785.

3. - The part marked "D" was formerly surveyed by "Orders of the Board of Property" of the 15th September 1784 and of the 7th of March 1785, to James Sullivan alias Swellwent, and for which a Patent issued to the Executors of James O'Hara, dec'd and Amelia Craig, dated the 26th February 1823, although it is not now claimed by them, that I can ascertain Gilliam has held adversely for nearly forty seven years.

4. - That part marked "E" does not appear to have been claimed by any person, so far as I am able to discover, and is therefore the only part that was clear of dispute; yet the whole is clear of dispute at this day, as I am informed by the owners of lands surrounding it.

5. - The parts marked "A" "C" "D" & "E" were formerly surveyed on a Warrant dated the 10th day of December 1784, on which there is this endorsement, viz:-
