



Situate on the East side of the Lawrel hill on the waters of Lawrel or Beaver Dam run a branch of Conemaugh in the township of Conemaugh County of Cambria containing three hundred and eighty four acres and ninety six perches and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c Surveyed the sixteenth day of February 1838 on a Warrant granted to Joseph Spiker dated the fourth day of April 1794 for 400 acres

Note. It appears by Testimony entitled to full credit exhibited to me that Frederick Cobach settled down upon a tract of land now in Conemaugh township in Cambria County Situate on Laurel or Beaver dam - run a branch of Conemaugh about a mile from <sup>the mouth of</sup> said run, in the month of Aprile Eighteen hundred and six, and built a house and barn thereon and cleased about thirty acres of land and continued in possession thereof by himself and his son Daniel under him up to the present time and paid the taxes thereon assessed from year to year ever since and that his said improvement is now ascertained by me to be within the lines of the annexed Survey and I certify that the said Daniel Cobach informed me that he now resides on the said tract of land as a Tenant to and by the permission of the said Fredrick Cobach.
