The dotted lines represent two larger tracts of land Viz: John Edwards containing 49 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres and allowance of six per cent $\frac{2}{3}\text{rd}$ Surveyed on Warrant dated the 3rd June 1763. the other in the name of James Rose Containing 534 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres and the usual allowance of six per cent for Roads $\frac{2}{3}\text{rd}$ Surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant dated the

The Black lines represent 146 acres and 80 perches and Allowance $\frac{2}{3}\text{rd}$ six per cent $\frac{2}{3}\text{rd}$ part of the John Edward tract, and 50 acres and Allowance part of the James Rose tract, which two last mentioned parts of the larger tracts were laid off according to the old division lines upon the ground for the Widow & heirs of the said John Mc Donald Esqr deceased the 10th October A.D. 1839
