


Note Improvements consisting of a Dwelling House and about 45 acres of Clear land now occupied by James Divinity -



Draught of a Tract of Land Situate Part in Fernanagh & Part in Greenwood Townships Mifflin County Containing Four hundred acres and 114 perches and the allowance of Six per Cent for roads &c Survey began June 24<sup>th</sup> 1801 and finished January 3<sup>d</sup> 1806 in pursuance of a Warrant Granted to James Divinity Dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of February 1801 -

Note Two hundred acres and 130 perches &c part of the above Tract appears to have been included in a Survey made the 5<sup>th</sup> of July 1793 - said to contain 413<sup>acres</sup> 63<sup>perches</sup> &c for Ezekiel King in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of May 1793 - and is shown to the Eastward of the Dotted line thro the above draught from the line of James Hamilton Esq. to the R. corner of Thomas Green:
