

A Containing two hundred acres & allowance of six per cent for Roads. It Being part of the same larger tract of four hundred acres of land & allowance Originally Surveyed unto John Klinger by virtue of a Warrent Granted to him dated the 1st day of July A.D. 1793. Resurveyed for John W. Roseberry, Jacob Huntingger, Jus. Henry Krebs, Benjamin Nehf, and Peter F. Ludwig this 2nd day of August A.D. 1851.

N.B. the tract with letter B for 143^{acres} 59^{perches} & allowance I do Return for James Taggart, and the tract with Letter A was returned by me on the John Klinger warrent for John W. Roseberry & Company on the 4th of August 1851, and was afterwards Surveyed & Returned on the James Taggart Warrent, by a mistake
