Draught of a Tract of Land situate part in Fannet and part in Metal Townships Franklin County, containing in the whole thirty five Acres, one hundred and thirty one perches & allowance of six per cent for Roads &c being part of 76 Acres 9 perches & allowance Surveyed 20<sup>th</sup> August 1791. In pursuance of a Warrant Granted to Alexander, John, James and Robert Potts dated 17<sup>th</sup> September 1784. Resurveyed the above part: the 30<sup>th</sup> October 1829. (by the undersigned under the direction of William Hamilton Esq. late D. surveyor;) including the part marked A. of five Acres & thirty three perches first included in the Original Survey in dispute with Hugh McCurdy - which piece of Land at a meeting of the Board on 1<sup>st</sup> Augt 1791 was given to said McCurdy on his Application N<sup>o</sup> 2581.; but subsequently the said piece of Land was by a Verdict of the Jury in Court of Common Pleas of F. County, given to Alexander Potts who now desires that a return of Survey including the same may be accepted in order for further confirmation by Patent. Certified 13<sup>th</sup> May 1830
