

 Shiloh in West Township Huntingdon County, James Childs said to contain 346.8



## Explanatory Notes

The Black Lines shew a Survey in the Name of William Robinson made the 19<sup>th</sup> of May 1766 on a Warrant dated the 20<sup>th</sup> September 1762. The Yellow Lines shew two Surveys in the Names of James Childs & Philip Benezet made on a Warrant dated the 2<sup>d</sup> August 1762. James Childs Tract Surveyed 12<sup>th</sup> June 1770, and Philip Benezet 5<sup>th</sup> October 1771. The Green Lines shew a Survey in the Name of Samuel Findlay made the 7<sup>th</sup> day of May 1766. on a Warrant dated 12<sup>th</sup> February 1763. The Lines shaded with Green shew a Survey in the Name of James McKnitt made the 21<sup>st</sup> April 1766 on a Warrant dated 5<sup>th</sup> April 1763. The dotted Lines shew a Survey in the Name of James Dickey made 27<sup>th</sup> October 1767 on an application No. 3119.
