



By Virtue of a Warrant Granted to Martin Bucher Dated the 25th day of August 1792 Surveyed the 11th day of September 1792 for sd Bucher the above Described Tract of Land including his Improvement Situate in East Hanover Township in the County of Dauphin Containing Three hundred and thirty three Acres and one hundred and fifteen Perches and the Allowance of six per Cent for Roads &c - Jno Weidman D.S.

Whereas by Virtue of an Order of the Board of Property dated the 1st day of April 1793 On Notice from the Deputy Surveyor we the Subscribers Martin Bucher and Daniel Bradly the Parties Concerned met on the Premises have mutually agreed to and with each other that the Deputy Surveyor (John Weidman) shall make a Return into the Surveyor General's office a Draught of the original survey made as above on the 11th day of September 1792 on the sd Martin Bucher's Warrant and that the Careat entered by sd M. Bucher against the sd Daniel Bradly shall and is hereby Discharged we acknowledge ourselves fully satisfied in the premises In Witness whereof we have this 1st day of August 1793 hereunto set our hands & seals -
