Surveyed and Laid off the above on the 9th day of March A.D. 1831 at the request of Michael Mitzell for the use of the said Henry Ziegler, &c. The part where the letter A stands, is a Part of a larger tract of 137.86 prs. & all. Originally Surveyed by Wm. Mathews late D.S. the 4th day of the 9th mo. 1765 for George and James Mitchel in pursuance of two warrants dated respectively the 12th Day of April 1763 &c. The Part where the letter B stands is part of 28.143 prs. & allowances. Originally Surveyed by Jacob Spangler late D.S. on the 19th October A.D. 1801 in Pursuance of a warrant granted to William Roseburg bearing date the 26th March A.D. 1800 the part where the letter C stands within the yellow lines is part of 98.55 prs. & allowances Surveyed to James Wilson the 12th & 13th Days of April A.D. 1805 in Pursuance of his warrant for 90th dated the 22nd December A.D. 1804 &c. that part within the red lines where the letter D stands belongs to Jacob Geesey's heirs &c. Now being Requested by the said Michael Mitzell and Henry Ziegler to make Return of the part within the yellow lines of 122.100 prs. & all for the use of said Henry Ziegler &c.
