



Draught of a tract of land Situate in the Township of Union and on a branch of Hunlock's Creek, in Luzerne County, Containing in the whole four hundred and nineteen acres and six perches of land with the usual allowance &c. And one hundred and five acres and one hundred and eight perches of land Clear of older Surveys Surveyed the above described tract of land for Stephen Arnold Senr the 29th day of May A.D. 1818. By virtue of his warrant dated the 14th day of May 1818.

N.B. Stephen Arnold was the first Settler and improver upon the above described land, and settled on said land A.D. 1792 and in the year 1793 or in the Spring of 1794 James Paul and John Watson was surveyed. Arnold informed me that he did not clear over the lines of James Paul until after the lines of said tract was run and marked. Arnold never had any lines marked upon the ground to which he claimed until they were run in pursuance of his warrant, which lines were run as he wished.

The lines edge with green are lines of older surveys. The lines edge with lake are the lines claimed by Arnold. And the piece shaded yellow, is clear from older surveys. John Bennet D.S.
