No. 1, represented by dotted lines is part of the draft of A tract of land Surveyed for Benjamin Burd & William Wilds on Warrant dated the 25d. day of February 1786. This tract interferes five acres and thirty two perches with the William Ramsey survey. William Wilds conveyed to Benjamin Burd who conveyed to Robert Tate who conveyed to John Keer from whom it was sold to Thomas & James McClelland the present owner. No. 2 represented by green lines is part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for John Burd on Warrant dated the 3d. day of June 1785, this tract interferes Twenty two acres and one hundred and five perches with the William Ramsey survey. John Burd devised this tract to Empson McNight who conveyed to Benjamin, ^{Burd} who conveyed to Robert Tate who conveyed to John Keer from whom it was sold by the Sheriff of Bedford County to Thomas & James McClelland the present owners. No. 3, represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for William McConnell on Order No. 843 dated 12th day of August, 1766. this tract interferes twenty acres and sixty nine perches with the William Ramsey survey. William McConnell conveyed to Mr. Findley from whom it was sold by the treasurer of Bedford County for taxes to Thomas R. Gettys who conveyed to Abraham Kerns the present owner. No. 4, represented by dotted lines is a draft of A tract of Land surveyed for Dunken McDonald the 9th day of May 1815 by virtue of an Improvement commenced before the year 1785. this tract interferes three acres with the William Ramsey survey. Dunken McDonald conveyed to Ephraim Wallace who conveyed to Robert Ramsey from whom it was sold to John Noble who conveyed to Charles Petitt the present owner.
