



A draft or a tract of land situate on the waters of Dunning's Creek and the waters of the Frankstown branch of Juniata.— In Greenfield Township, Bedford County containing four hundred and fifty three acres and forty perches and allowance of six per cent for Roads. Surveyed for Edward Evans on Order No. 29 dated the 1st day of August 1766.

No. 1 represented by the large coulored lines is a draft of a tract of land surveyed for James Johnston on warrant dated the 1st day of June 1763. This tract interferes four hundred and fifty three acres and forty perches with the Edward Evans tract. James Johnston conveyed to Daniel Clark and Dr. Wm. Smith. Daniel Clark conveyed to the firms of Milford and Roberts and Neate and Pegeon. The heirs of Milford & Roberts now claim the land. Neate & Pegeon conveyed to William Neate whose heirs now claim. Dr. William Smith purchased the whole tract from Edward Evans and devised the same to Charles Goldsbrough the present owner of the Edward Evans tract.

No. 2 represented by dotted lines is part of A draft of A tract of land surveyed for William Kennedy on order No. 1367 dated the 26th day of September 1766. This tract interferes one acre and one hundred and fifteen perches with the Edward Evans survey. William Kennedy conveyed to James Hunter who devised the same to James Hunter the present owner.
