

A Draft of A Tract of Land situate in Martin's Cove in Southampton township Bedford County containing Two hundred and eighty seven acres and one hundred and fifty six perches and allowance of Six per Cent for Roads &c Surveyed for John Cridlan the 26th day of December 1791 on Order No. 1712 dated the 28th day of October 1766.

No. 1 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for Lemuel Barrett the 18th day of November 1766, on Order No. 1346 dated the 24th day of September 1766. This tract interferes seventy nine acres and eighty seven perches with the John Cridlan survey. Lemuel Barrett conveyed to Capt. Thomas Bassett who conveyed to Charles Coxe, who also purchased from John Cridlan and conveyed to John Lasure who owns part thereof to William Perdew who conveyed part to Eliza Perdew Esqr. the present owner. William Perdew owns part thereof. No. 2 represented by dotted lines a draft of A tract of land surveyed for James Dow on warrant dated the 1st day of June 1763. This tract interferes one hundred and seventy nine acres and one

thirty six perches with the John Cridlan survey. James Dow conveyed to Capt. Thomas Bassett who conveyed to Charles Coxe who also purchased from John Cridlan and conveyed to John Lasure and William Perdew. John Lasure now owns part of said tract. William Perdew conveyed part to Eliza Perdew Esqr. the present owner. William Perdew now owns part of said tract. No. 3 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for Thomas Barnsley on warrant dated the 1st day of June 1763. This tract interferes twenty eight acres and thirty three perches with the John Cridlan survey. Thomas Barnsley conveyed to Capt. Thomas Bassett who conveyed to Charles Coxe who conveyed as above described
