This survey interferes seventy one acres and twenty seven perches with the Joshua Elder survey. The Joshua Elder tract was sold for taxes to David Mc Murtrie who obtained the aforesaid warrant and conveyed to William Johnston the present owner.

The red lines represent a survey made for William Johnston on Warrant dated the 15th day of February 1794, this survey interferes one hundred acres and one hundred and twenty one perches with the Joshua Elder survey. William Johnston is the present owner.
