



Situate on the West Side of Shavers Creek, and on the waters thereof in West Township, Huntingdon County, containing two hundred and seventy acres and allowance. Surveyed the 31st day of May 1775 for William Main on Order No. 4327, dated 24th day of August 1767.

To Jacob Spangler Esqr 5 G George Ervin Pat'd George Wilson, not pat'd.

The dotted lines represent the draught of of a tract of land surveyed for George Ervin on warrant dated the 3rd day of November 1788, This tract interferes two hundred and forty-eight acres & sixty nine perches with the William Main survey. William Main's heirs conveyed to Alexander Murry and George Ervin who had obtained the aforesaid warrant. Alexander Murry conveyed his part of said tract to Robert Spencer the present owner. George Ervin conveyed part to James Connor the present owner. The residue Geo. Ervin devised the residue to his heirs who conveyed to William Young who conveyed to Adam Warfield the present owner. The green lines represent part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for George Wilson on warrant dated the 17th day of September 1812. This tract interferes twenty-one acres and one hundred perches with the William Main survey. Patrick Ricketts about forty years ago and conveyed to George Wilson who obtained the aforesaid warrant and who conveyed to James Porter. Part the residue was sold by Geo. Wilson's heirs to John Walls the present owner.
