No. 1. Thomas Coleman, not ret'd. James Ferral, not found, Mary McCarron, Paid

✓ No. 1 represents part of a survey made for Thomas Coleman on Warrant dated the 25th day of March 1787. This survey interferes eighteen acres and fifty five perches with the Edward Murphrey tract. Thomas Coleman is the present owner.

✓ No. 2 represents part of a survey made for Abraham Fetter on an improvement made some years ago. This survey interferes thirty seven acres and forty two perches with the Edward Murphrey survey. Abraham Fetter is the present owner.

✓ No. 3 represents part of a survey made for James Ferral on warrant dated the 15th day of November 1787. This survey interferes one hundred and twenty four acres and one hundred and fifty five perches with the Edward Murphrey tract. James Ferral conveyed to Edward Hodges who conveyed to George Fetter who conveyed to Daniel McCalla who is the present owner of the interference.

✓ No. 4 represents part of a survey made for Richard Glasco by virtue of an improvement commenced in 1798. This survey interferes sixty two & one half acres with the Edward Murphrey tract. Richard Glasco is the present owner.

✓ No. 6 represents a survey made for Jacob Cherry on Warrant dated the 23rd day of February 1815. This survey interferes forty two acres and one hundred and fifty two perches with the Edward Murphrey survey. Jacob Cherry is the present owner.

✓ No. 5 represents part of a survey made for Mary McCarron on Warrant dated the 21st day of September 1795. This survey interferes twenty nine acres and eight four perches with the Edward Murphrey tract. Mary McCarron conveyed to John Gullifer who conveyed to Joseph Hutchison the present owner.

No. 7 represents part of a survey made for John Baynton & Samuel Wharton on warrant dated the 28th day of July 1766. This survey interferes thirty nine acres and thirty six perches with the Edward Murphrey tract. John Baynton & Samuel Wharton conveyed to Richard Neave Senr. & Richard Neave Jr. who conveyed to Andrew Cherry the present owner.
