To Jacob Spangler Esqr. S.G. No 1 represents a survey made for John Gills on warrant dated the 25th day of November 1789. This survey interferes one hundred and forty one acres with the Jacob Wise tract. John Gills conveyed to Christian Black who conveyed to Samuel Glasco, who devised the same to his widow & heirs the present owners.

No. 2 represents part of a survey made for John Swarts on warrant dated the 7th day of January 1797. This survey interferes seven acres and 12 perches with the Jacob Wise survey. John Swarts conveyed to James More the present claimant

No. 3 represents a survey made for John Coleman on warrant dated the 5th day of May, 1823. This survey interferes thirty nine acres and one hundred and fifty nine perches with the Jacob Wise survey. John Coleman is the present owner.

No. 4 represents part of a survey made for Richard Glasco on an improvement made in 1798. This survey interferes fourteen acres and one hundred and twenty six perches with the Jacob Wise survey. Richard Glasco is the present owner.

No. 5 represents part of a survey made for Abraham Fetter on an improvement made some years ago. This survey interferes twenty acres and thirty five perches with the Jacob Wise tract. Abraham Fetter is the present owner.

No. 6 represents part of a survey made for Thomas Coleman on warrant dated the 23d day of March, 1787. This survey interferes sixty four acres and one hundred and sixty perches with the Jacob Wise survey. Thomas Coleman is the present owner. The green lines represent part of a survey made for George Ward on warrant dated the 28th day of February 1785, this survey interferes eighteen and one half acres with the Jacob Wise tract. George Ward conveyed to George Duffield who devised the same to his heirs, who conveyed to Michael Wallace the present owner.
