



Surveyed August 24th 1791 for George Dixon on a warrant to be procured by him. — Endorsed on the Draught. — A Warrant has been taken by George Dixon in the name of John Mackey for Fifty acres of Land including an improvement adjoining Land of Thomas Armstrong Ludwick Ripple & George Dixon in Fannett Township in the County of Franklin dated the 1st day of November 1790. Interest to Commence from the 1st day of October 1780. Dixon informs me that Mackey has thrown the warrant on his hands and that he has paid him the money which it cost and yet Mackey declines to assign him the Warrant. N.B. it appears that the warrant is rather located for the Land where Mackey lives. I am not to return the Land until the matter is settled in some way. November 25th 1791.
