



The Two Tracts of Land above described were Survey'd for Hugh Torbett in Pursuance of two Warrants from the Proprietaries of Pennsyl^a. One Granted to the said Hugh the 7th of December 1737. Another to his Brother John Torbett the 24th of March 1742. (vacating a former warrant bearing Date the 18th of July 1739, which was obtain'd by one John Scott & directing the Execution thereof for said John Torbett) whose Right was transfer'd to the said Hugh Torbett. The former warrant was Executed by my Father & formerly return'd. But this Draught Exhibits both surveys in full & was divided at the Request of the said Hugh Torbett as above the 12th of the 11th mo 1765
