



These may certifie that By vertue of a warrant under ye hand and seal of Edward Pennington Surveyor Genl^l to me directed bearing date ye seventh day of 8th moneth 1701.

I Resurveyed to Thomas Marshall a tract of land situate in Middle Town in ye County of Chester Beginning at a white oak standing by ~~Ridley~~ Creek thence south 66 degrees westerly in ye line of Daniell Smith & William Gregory 317 per to a Hickory then south 15 deg easterly 185 perches in the line of George Ashbridge to to a Hickory then south 24 deg easterly 64 perches to a sassafras by a run side ther down ye said Run Nor. 30 deg easterly 24 perches then north 60 deg east 66 perches then north 30 deg easterly 32 perches thence north 50 deg east 74 per ~~deg~~ thence north 23 deg easterly 60 perches ~~deg~~ thence north 38 degrees east 34 perches to a white oak by ye sd Run thence north 66 deg east by a line of marked trees 120 perches to a Persimmon tree by ~~(obly)~~ Creek thence up sd Creek north 40 perches thence north 70 degrees west 37 perches thence north west 68 perches to the place of Beginning Containing 373 Acres Resurveyed the 17th day of ye 8th moneth 1701.
