



By virtue of a warrant from the Gover. bearing date the 1st of 4th mo^o 1682.
 Layed out for Jermi Collit a tract of land called — Situated & being on the west side of Delaware River & on (the) west side of the main branch of Christester Creek and next adjoining to the land belonging to Christester.
 Beginning at a corner marked w^t oak standing at the mouth of a small branch, and by the side of Christester Creek, from thence S.S.W. 33 perches to a corner marked Spanish oak standing by 3^d branch, from thence N. 65 by Christester tree of marked trees 240 perches to a corner marked (oak) standing in (oak) line from thence N.W. by a line of marked trees 160 perches to a corner marked w^t oak, from thence due N. by a line of marked — 82 perches to a corner marked w^t oak from thence E.N.E. by a line of marked trees 97 perches to a corner marked maple standing by the side of of Christester Creek, from thence downe by 3^d Creek on severall courses, 400 perches to the first mentioned w^t oak containing 250 acres of land.
