A Map of Patr: Robison's Land in the County of Philadelphia containing 200 acres Surveyed the first of Jano 1783 by T.F. & C. G. Cheltenham parish in the Province of Pennsylvania. The boundaries of the tract are as follows: Beginning at a stake near unto an oak sapling thence by the land of Richard Wallis 480 perches S.W. to a stake by a small black oak marked for a corner thence N.W. 66 2/3 perch to a stake upon a hill neare unto a swamp thence N.E. 480 perch to a stak standing about 4 perches to the northward of a large poplar tree marked for another corner thence S.E. 66 2/3 perch to the first mentioned place of beginning g.t. 200 acres of land.

Frank for 1R 2E of ye 2d 1770th 1683.

By virtue of a Narraray bearing date ye 14<sup>th</sup> of ye first 1770th 1683 Surveyed for Patrick Robison A certaine tract of land by Taokany Creek now called Frank Creek Beginning at a stake near unto an oak saplyng thence by the land of Richard Wallis 480 perches S.W. to a stake by a small black oak marked for a corner thence N.W. 66 2/3 perch to a stake upon a hill neare unto a swamp thence N.E. 480 perch to a stak standing about 4 perches to the northward of a large poplar tree marked for another corner thence S.E. 66 2/3 perch to the first mentioned place of beginning g.t. 200 acres of land. This tract of land is in the parish of Cheltenham Surveyed ye first of ye 7<sup>th</sup> 1770th 1683.
