

By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the 18<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> month Anno-1702 for Resurveying unto James Hunt three parcels of land joyned in one tract and containing by Estimation two hundred and sixty six acres all taken up on Old rent and situate in Kingsessing in the County of Philadelphia to be resurvey'd in one tract also to resurvey a certain tract of Marsh or Meadow Situate between Kingsessing and land Creek Reputed to Contain forty five acres. There was resurvey'd to the said James Hunt a tract of land Situate in the said Kingsessing. Beginning at an Ash tree at the corner of Andrew Jones land Then by the said James land north twenty three degrees west forty five perches. Then north 59 degrees west eleven perches Then north sixty four degrees west eighteen perches Thence north west by the <sup>5d</sup> Andrew Jones land one hundred sixty and nine perches to a white oak Then Continuing the same course sixteen perches to an ash tree by a small branch of Calcoonthook Creek Then down on the several courses thereof two hundred twenty five perches to another ash tree then south forty seven deg. west twenty seven perches to a white oak Then south fifteen degrees west ninety perches to Boons Bridge Then by the said Bridge south 57 deg east 28 $\frac{1}{4}$  perches to Calcoonthook, Then by the courses of the said Creek two hundred seventy nine perches and a half to an ash tree by the said Creek Then by Andrew Jones land north 41 degrees east twenty seven perches to a post Then by the said Jones land north seventy east seventy perches to a post Then south ten deg. east 42 perches Then south 30 deg. east 5 $\frac{1}{2}$  perches Then south 3 degrees west 13 perches Then east eleven degrees north 30 perches to the aforesaid Creek Then by the same north 17 degrees west 12 perches Then north 18 east 9 $\frac{1}{2}$  to the place of the Beginning Containing one hundred and ninety acres.

With another piece or parcel of land and meadow. Beginning at a Plum Tree standing in a Marsh or Creepie. Then south twenty five Degrees west eighty perches to Calcoonthook Creek Then down the same on several courses two hundred twenty five perches to a post by the said Creek Then west seven ~~perches~~ perches. Then west twenty three north 14 perches. Then west fifteen degrees south six perches Then north west 170 perches to a black oak at a corner of Andrew Jones land. Thence north 23 degrees east 45 perches. Then south east 68 perches Then east 13 degrees south nine perches, east 3 degrees south nine perches east 16 degrees south 9 perches east south east ten perches south forty nine, east 52 perches south 9 east 6 $\frac{1}{2}$  per south 19 $\frac{1}{2}$  west 17 perches. Then east by south 172 perches to the Beginning containing one hundred twenty eight acres.

Also a small piece of land containing eleven acres and a half beginning at a stake near a Branch of the Calcoonthook Creek Thence by a piece of ~~land called overplus~~ Overplus land West thirty six perches west 9 degrees north 19 perches west 13 $\frac{1}{2}$  19 perches north eleven degrees east 35 perches to a Black oak Then by the line of John Neals land east 15 degrees south 68 per. Thence ~~south~~ 7 degrees west 24 $\frac{1}{2}$  perches to the Beginning.
