Whereas Pokhais Sepopanwy Muttagooppa and others of ye Nation called ye Oketrockiny Indians in Chester County with their families upon their Removal from their late Settlement near Ridly and Grunn Creeks have by the Proprietors Ord^t and Appointm^t been seated on another certain Tract in ye sd County and on the sd Ridly Creek nearer ye head thereof formerly surveyd to Griffith Jones but by him left & acquitted & now belonging to ye Proprietary: In which place the said Indians request we would grant th(obl.) certain Settlement under sure Metes and Bounds to them and their Posterity in pursuance of the Proprietors Engagem^t in that case made before his departure, who granted them, as tis credibly affirmed to us five hundred acres in ye sd place: These therefore are in pursuance of the sd grant to authorize & require thee to survey and lay out to the said Pokhais Sepopanwy Muttagooppa and others of ye sd Nation called ye Oketrockiny Indians who were lately seated lower on ye sd creek & their Relations and to no other whatsoever the full quantity of five hundred acres of land in one square tract in such place within the aforesd Tract as the sd Indians shall desire: Which said five hundred acres we doe hereby grant to the sd Pokhais Sepopanwy Muttagooppa and others of the sd Nation called the Oketrockin Indians who were lately seated as aforesaid and to their Relations, & to no other whatsoever, to have & hold to them the said Indians for a settlem^t and to their Posterity of the same Nation of Indians (and no other) forever. Provided always that the sd Indians nor any of them shall not give, grant or attempt (obl.) sell or any way dispose of any of the said five hundred acres of land hereby granted to any person whatsoever. But at such time as the sd Indians shall quitt or leave the said place, it shall be surrendered to ye Proprietary without any further claim of the sd Indians or any person whatsoever by or under them their Title or Procurement. And make returns into the General Surveyors office Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 15th of ye 10th moth 1702.
