Upon the request of Richard Peters William Peters and Richard Hackley Attorneys of Thomas Penn Esq^r that we would be pleased to grant them a resurvey on all that Front lot and two other lots in Two Streets backwards, on or near to Delaware River, bounding towards the south on Spruce Street and lying and being between Front Street and Second Street and between Second Street and Third Street and between Third Street and Fourth Street in the City of Philadelphia, and extending on the East part one hundred and Two Feet or thereabouts, little more or less, and bounding on the northern part on other lands lying severally and respectively between the sd Front Street and Second Street, and between the Second Street and Third Street and between the Third Street and Fourth Street; For which sd Front lot and Two other lots in Two Streets backwards a warrant was granted bearing date on or about the twenty fifth day of July in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Six Hundred and Eighty Four, by William Penn Esq^r late Proprietary deceased, unto Richard Marsh since deceased, as appurtenant to his Original Purchase of Ten Thousand Acres, but no return was made on the sd warrant; And the same Three Lots are by Meane Acts and Assurances in the Law now come to and vested in the sd Thomas Penn.

These are therefore to authorize and require you to Resurvey or cause to be Resurveyed unto the sd Attorneys, and for the use of the sd Thomas Penn as well the sd Front Lot as the sd Two other Lots, situate respectively as aforesaid; And to make return into our Secretary's Office of each of the sd Three Lots, separately and distinctly, in order for Confirmation. And for so doing this shall be your sufficient warrant. Given under my hand and the Seal of the Land Office, by virtue of certain Powers from the sd Proprietaries at Philadelphia this Twenty fourth day of December Anno Domini
