



By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the — Day of — Surveyed and laid out for John Budd and Humphrey Morry a certain tract of land situate in the County of Philadelphia near Upper Dublin Township Beginning at a corner of Society land being a white oak thence by land Reputed Henry Pennabakers south west one hundred and eightie perches to a Black oak thence by the said Henry's land north west seventy two perches to a white oak being a corner of said Budd and Morry's other land thence by the same south west two hundred thirtie and one perches to a post on the North side of a branch of Parkiomink — called Nitchink, thence down the said branch according to the several courses thereof two hundred and seventy perches to a Beach tree standing one the south side of the said Branch thence by Vacant land south sixty degrees easterly eighty and eight perches to to a post thence by Vacant land north east one hundred thirty and six perches to a small wt oak standing in Society line thence along the saitie north west Two hundred sixty four perches to the place of Beginning Containing four hundred sixty five acres without allowance Surveyed —
