



for the buying five hundred acres of land to Derick Johnson  
of London

By virtue of two warrants from the Commissioners of Property, the one bearing date the Twenty eighth Day of August 1719, in  
right of Thomas Parkhurst Citizen and Stationer, the other bearing date the 5<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>rd</sup> month 1719 for the laying out of  
Eight hundred acres of land to ye said Derick Johnson being a purchase made by him of the sd Commissioners there was laid  
out to the said Johnson in the County of Philad<sup>e</sup> on a branch of Perkiomie Creek a certain tract of land beginning at a black  
oak a corner of Henry Reeds land thence by the same north east one-thirty seven perches to a black-a corner of the said Reeds  
land thence by the same land south east eighty perches to a white oak Saplin-thence by land of Isaac Glyn north east one  
hundred and eight perches to a white oak thence by land of Christian Miar north west one hundred thirty one perches to a  
post thence by land of the sd Christian Miar north east two hundred thirty three perches to a post thence by land of Henry  
Funk north west ninety five perches to a white oak thence by the same land sixty two perches to a post being a corner of Hans  
Nise's land thence by same and vac<sup>t</sup> land <sup>north west</sup> Two hundred sixty six perches to a post thence by vac<sup>t</sup> land south west two hun-  
dred and fifteen perches perches to a black oak thence by land of John Hurnsted south east eighty four perches to a post thence  
by ye sd Hurnsted and vac<sup>t</sup> land south west three hundred twenty five perches to a post thence <sup>south</sup> east by Garret Clements  
land three hundred <sup>& twenty</sup> eight perches to the place of Beginning containing one thousand ~~seventy three~~<sup>fifty two</sup> acres (with ye usual  
allowance) in part of the above thirteen hundred acres Surveyed June ye 24<sup>th</sup> 1729 & Nicholas Scull
