



By virtue of a warrant from Edward Pennington Surveyor General directed unto me bearing date 12 of the 7th mo 1700 I hereby certify into his office that I have resurveyed a certain tract of land yt was formerly laid out unto Christopher Penock and reputed to be one thousand acres beginning in a line of Cadwalader Lewis and Matthew Clements land being part of the said tract from thence north 32 degrees west one hundred and sixty five perches; thence north west one hundred ninety six perches to a stake being a corner of John Holands land from thence east north east four hundred and forty eight perches to a chestnut tree marked by Scoulkeele and by the several courses as under S. E. b. S. 130 perches, south & by east 48 per 5. 30. E. 20.: S. E. b. S. 24 perches, S. S. E. 58 perches, S. E. 66 perches; S. E. b. E. 10 perches to a Spanish oak marked from thence N. S. W. 458 perches to the place of Beginning, containing 963 a. and 32 perches as by the protracted figure annexed doth appear as by the prick line shewing the bounds of the said thousand acres the rest being overplus, taken from it after ye first Return and Lyes as the said figure appears and containing 924 acres & 98 perches.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this
