

An Act of Lawrence & Joseph Grondons Lands in Pennsylvania.

Lawrence Grondon & his son Joseph Grondon original purchasers each of 5000 acres of land in the Province aforesaid.

Year Mo. day Warrt granted by the Prop<sup>ty</sup> to Lawrence & Joseph Grondon for 5000<sup>00</sup> No return thereof is to be found in the office.

1684 6 5 Another warrt by the prop<sup>ty</sup> to J. Grondon for the overplus land } joining to him on the River Delaware. } No Return &c.

1684 1 20 Another warrt granted by the Prop<sup>ty</sup> to J. Grondon for a resurvey } on the lands on Delaware between the Miller's & Nathaniel Allens } No Return &c.

1684 5 25 Warrt by the Prop<sup>ty</sup> to Jos. Grondon for City Lots & Liberty Lands &c } A return of the survey of the Liberty land -- 160<sup>00</sup> which is since found to contain an allowance of 10<sup>00</sup> & cent more.

1685 7 15 Warrt by Comm<sup>ee</sup> for the Liberty Land appurt<sup>t</sup> to the whole Purchases About the year 1700 a Law was passed for a General Resurvey of the

Province in pursuance whereof & upon Joseph Grondons Application

1701 11 21 Warrt granted by the Comm<sup>ee</sup> to resurvey the lands of Lawrence & Joseph Grondon. Resurveyed in one Tract Pound 6507

1702 9 26 Warrt granted to Dab<sup>d</sup> Lloyd for 1000<sup>00</sup> in right of his father in Law & Joseph Grondon. 117 another No allowance for roads &c as provided by Law if found within the old lines.

1703 4 8. Warrt granted to Joseph Grondon for 1000<sup>00</sup> being the Remainder Surveyed in Chester County 1000. of his fathers & his own original purchase according to his Computation 9975

Upon the Application of Joseph Grondon to the Comm<sup>ee</sup> on the 20<sup>th</sup> of the first Month 1715/6. complaining of divers disappointments in laying out his City Lots & being kept out as he alledged from taking up the lands due to him by the Prop<sup>ty</sup> Concessions for introducing above forty servants on his own Acct into this Province.

In Consideration whereof & of his publick services to this Government the sd Comm<sup>ee</sup> granted him a warrt for taking up 2000 acres of land within this Province at 15 Sterl<sup>00</sup> & Cent quit Rent which was surveyed to him in two tracts.
