These is presented to yo<sup>r</sup> consideration in order to prevent a just cause of resection upon myself for my remissness in aquairting you in time of what I think I ought to be allowed under the considerations under the considerations hearein presented when Gover<sup>r</sup> Penn came one shore, before there was either house or shed built in Philadelphia I mett him at which time I became first aquainted with him and soone after he was pleased to order me into an Imploy the wch I have binne continuall dureing the Life of the then Survey<sup>r</sup> Generall and suffered very much hardships, and very smal profit yeat never covited the least value from any man directly or indirectly but the bare feese allowed me, I also served the proprietor uppon all occasions when ever he was pleased to command without grudgeing or demanding the least value for any servise done him. Ever since the time aforesd always looking upon myself under advb obligation to answer his favours ~~sustained~~<sup>bestowed</sup> to me so freely without the least petitioning for it, by my faithfullness to him in my station and leaving the charge of my servise to him one his one proper acc<sup>t</sup> to his will pleasure, not demanding or yeat receveiring the value of one peirce for the same nor yeat do demande but the benefit of his favours continued and such other advantadge as he hath been pleased of his one free will to grant me the wch is well known to one of yo<sup>r</sup> selves and as to my actions so fare as I have binne concarried in the Imploy thay are publik and in yo<sup>r</sup> power to examine if you please and if you find them not worthy yo<sup>r</sup> note you are the more excusable in excluding me from the benefit of the Governors favours continued if otherwise you do not find that I have forfeited the same by misbehaviour I hope you will find cause in justice I ought to have the benefit Expected as aforesd and (obl.) further I do aquaint you that it think me not worthy of the wch as I have had it sinc<sup>r</sup> the Governor carrie it last and continued the same whil<sup>r</sup> he was heare you may be pleased to dispose of it all for I have considered that it will not be of value to me, nor answer my loss of time to offend it I thought it my duty considering yo<sup>r</sup> station & power to recommend it to you & leave the wch to yo<sup>r</sup> Consideration not dounting but you will do me Justice herein who ready to answer and serve you on the the Governors acc<sup>t</sup> at Command and yo<sup>r</sup> selves as yo<sup>r</sup> friend.
