

Whereas the Commissioners of Property by their warrant dated the 30th day of July 1712 Granted to Isaac Norris Esq. Ten acres of Liberty land in right of William Lovel and by their warrant dated the 25th day of the first month 1715 Required me to survey to John Falconar and Andrew Hamilton sixty acres of land in the Liberties of Philadelphia in right of Charles Marshal's Purchase of 6000 thousand acres which right of sixty acres was conveyed by Andrew Hamilton and Gilbert Falconer Brother & Attorney to the said John Falconar among other lands to the said Isaac Norris by Deeds dated the 22^d & 23^d days of April 1715 and whereas the said Commissioners by their further warrant dated the 16th day of January in the year 1726 Granted to the said Isaac Norris thirty six acres of Liberty land in further right of Charles Marshal ~~&~~ Jonah Smith and Company. And the said Commis^r having also by their warrant dated the 10th day of Jan^r in the year 1721 Granted to John Davis twenty acres of Liberty land in right of William Kent's purchase of 1250 acres the right of which twenty acres is now invested in the said Isaac Norris. Now this ^{may} certifie that in pursuante of the warrants and rights above mentioned I have surveyed and laid out several Parcels of land within the northern Liberties as follow's That is to say I did on the first day of 8th 1715 lay out unto Nicholas Wain Assignee of the said Isaac Norris twenty acres of land And I did on the 23^d day of April 1723 Survey a piece of land Beginning at a post at a corner of Thomas Gallowhill's land and running by other land of the said Isaac Norris south south east one hundred and five perches to a post Then by Job Goodson's land West south west sixty three perches to a post. Then north north west by the said Goodson's land ninety two perches then on the same course thirteen perches by the said Thomas Gallowhill's land to a post Then by another line of the said Gallowhill's land ^{east northeast} sixty three perches to the place of begining Containing forty acres.

And I did on the 20th day of 8th 1727 Survey a piece of land Beginning at a post at a corner of Joseph Shippens land Thence south south east by the said Shippens ^{land} ^{of William Palmer's land} sixty two perches Then by the said Shippens land and the land of John Shires west south west ninety perches Then north north west by vacant land and William Palmer's land sixty two perches Then east south east ninety perches to the place of Beginning Containing thirty four acres. And on the same twentieth day of 8th I did further survey and lay out another Piece of land Beginning at a corner of Edward Morris land and running by the same north north west one hundred and seventy perches, Then west south west twenty five perches Then by Thomas Shute's land and other south south east one hundred and seventy perches, Then east north east twenty five perches to the place of beginning Containing twenty six acres.

And for the full Compleating of all the above mentioned warrants & rights I did on the 15th day of October 1728 Survey and lay out by the falls of the River Schuylkil a piece of land Beginning at a corner ^{of William Palmer's land} on the eastern bank of the said River Thence east north east by the said Palmer's land eleven perches to a corner Stone Then south sixty five degrees east by Wissahickon Road forty two perches to a heap of Stones Then south fifty degrees west thirty eight perches to the said River Schuylkil Then up the same on the courses thereof about forty four perches to the place of Beginning Containing six acres.
