Beginning at a large Poplar Tree thence by vacant land south forty degrees west two hundred and ten perches to a small white oak sapling thence by vacant land north forty degrees west eight hundred forty six perches to a post thence by vacant land north forty degrees east four hundred and ninety perches to a white oak tree thence by vacant land south fifty degrees east four hundred thirty six perches to a Chestnut Tree thence by vacant land south forty degrees west two hundred and eighty perches to a white oak tree thence by vacant land south fifty degrees east four hundred & ten perches to ye place of beginning Cont One thousand seven hundred sixty seven acres with allowance of six & cent Survey'd June 11th 1730
