Surveyed and laid out the 15th day of October Anno 1730 unto William Allen of Philadelphia Esq; a tract of land situate in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a post in George Ritter's line, thence by vacant southwest seventy two perches to a post then south east one hundred and forty perches to a white oak marked thence south west one hundred eighty eight perches to another white oak thence north west one hundred perches to a post thence south west one hundred forty two perches to a black oak marked thence north west one hundred and forty perches to a post thence south west sixty perches to a black oak thence north west one hundred sixty four perches to a hickory thence south west fifty six perches to a post thence north west one hundred and three perches to a post thence south west one hundred twenty perches to a black oak sapling thence north west one hundred sixty seven perches to a post thence north east three hundred and fourteen perches to a hickory thence south east one hundred seventy nine perches to a post thence north east one hundred and six perches to a post thence south east seventy one perches to a post thence north east ninety four perches to a post thence south east fifty four perches to a black oak thence north east one hundred twenty four perches to a post thence south east by vacant land and the land of George Ritter aforesaid two hundred and thirty perches to the Place Beginning containing one thousand three hundred and forty three acres with allowance of six & Cent.
