

One Tract Beginning on the bank of Delaware River at a corner of Johannis Vankirks land & extending thence by ~~Johannes Vankirk's land~~ ^{the same} N 23° W 199 per. to a post thence by Jacob Vankirks land N 67 E 450. to a post & N 23 W 168 per. to Potquessink Creek thence up the several courses of the same 336 perches to a post thence by land reputed Sam'l Hasels E.S. Whereas Law: Grondon & his son Jos: Grondon being separate origin^s Purchasers each of 5000 ^{ac} of land within this Pro. the sd J.G obtained a warrant from the late Prop^r dated the 20th 1st mo. 1684 for a resur^y of a tract of land on Delaware Rive between the Millers & Natti^s Allens land in Bensalem Township Bucks Co. a settlement having therin before been made on the same for the sd pur^g or one of y^e 1st But no resur^y appear^s to have been made in pursu^s thereof upon a further applica^s of the sd J.G. the Comr^r of Prop^r on the 21st 11th mo. 1701 issued y^e warrant to resur^y the same wh^{ch} was accord^g executed on the 27th 1710: 1702 & found to contain 1306 ^{ac} part y^e of in right of ye sd L.G. & part in right of ye sd J.G. purchases^s & whereas ye aforesd L.G. by D^r of L & Rel. bearing date res: ye - 8 - days of 17 - did grant & convey ye 5000 by h^tch purchases^s as aforesd to his grandson L.G. son of the sd J.G. in fee & ye sd L.G. ye young^r at a supr. co. for ye sd Prop. held at Philad^a ye - day of 173 - have^s obtained a writ of partit^s & in pursu^s thereof the above mentioned 1306 was in ye year 1740 div'd into 2 pt^s & one pt^s was allotted assign^g & delivered to ye sd L.G. to hold to him & his heirs in severalty consisting of 2 tracts sit: in the Town of Bensalem in ye Co. of Bucks The one begin^g &c ut supra.

(Note attached) Lawrence Grondon the younger being vested with a right of 5000 ^{ac} of land in the Province of Pennsylvania the original purchase of his grandfather Lawrence Grondon holds in Bensalem in Bucks Co: in part thereof in one tract 2957 9 & Allow: of 10^d & 8 cent.
