



Boundings and boundings of two hundred acres of land Surveyed unto Samuel Allin by virtue of the Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> warrant Beginning at a black oak standing neare the mouth of a little run on the south west side of Mashamony Creek thence north west up the said Run by the land formerly layes out to Dunkin Williams and Francis Walker forty perches to a white oak marked for a corner thence north by the said Williams and Walkers land three hundred and fourteen perches to a post for a corner thence west south west one hundred and seventeen perches to a post for another corner thence south two hundred and sixty perches to a post for another corner thence south east and by east one hundred forty five perches to a post for another corner standing close to the banke of Mashamony Creek thence up by the severall courses of the said Creek sixty five perches to the first mentioned corner marked black oak 9<sup>t</sup> 2009
