



This tract of 300 was returned before and the draught is still in the office.

This 140 acres with 113 acres added by a survey made the 23<sup>rd</sup> of 8<sup>th</sup> 1729 are returned for George Leonard by a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the first day of June 1733.



This 140 acres is part of 300 acres ordered by Secretary Steel to be surveyed to ye sd M. Musgrove.



Moses Musgrove's land in ye great valley on the west side of John Musgrove's settlement. Beginning at a corner marked white oak on the south side of a small branch of Octoraro thence south by east by the same land and vacant land 240 perches thence north 64 percs to a post thence west by south by vacant to a Hickory tree thence W by south by vacant land 212 perches land 340 per. to a Black oak thence S. E. by S. by vacant to a white oak thence north by west by vacant land 240 perches land 60 perches to a small white oak thence south 72<sup>rd</sup> easterly 66 per. to a white oak then north 74<sup>th</sup> easterly 348 perches to ye Place of Beginning containing 140 acres with ye usual allowance for roads and highways.

Survey'd December 28, 1721.

Beginning at a post at the north west corner of George Pierce's land to a white oak on the south side of a small branch of Octoraro thence south by east by the same land and vacant land 240 perches thence north 64 percs to a post thence west by south by vacant to a Hickory tree thence W by south by vacant land 212 perches land 340 per. to a Black oak thence S. E. by S. by vacant to a white oak thence north by west by vacant land 240 perches land 60 perches to a small white oak thence south 72<sup>rd</sup> easterly 66 per. to a white oak then north 74<sup>th</sup> easterly 348 perches to ye Place of Beginning containing 300 acres with ye usual allowance for roads and highways.
